Aftersight includes podcasts, navigating life with vision loss, mental health help and provides a program that is devoted to technology that can make life with vision loss easier.

Guest Speakers: Sara Flatt and Amanda Webb Volunteers of America Adams County Senior Programs

Program opportunities include **volunteering** in the Foster Grandparent Program, Retired Senior Volunteer Program and Meals on Wheels deliveries. Meals on Wheels Dining Centers and deliveries, Healthy Moves, Healthy Aging Classes, City Harvest Food Bank and Handyman program are all apart of their **services**. The **Meals on Wheels** program currently needs drivers to pick up and deliver meals to Seniors. Contact: <u>adamsmowvolunteers@voacolorado.org</u> or Maddy at 720-397-2213.

The VOA meals which meet nutrition guidelines and are provided for senior living facilities and centers open to the public. Locations are currently at Eagle View Senior Center in Brighton and VOA ANS Building in Commerce City.

Focusing on fitness and nutrition are a part of the **Healthy Aging Service.** These are done in classes or inhome settings. STEPS to healthier aging, a diabetes prevention program, and a healthy aging exercise program called Healthy Moves are a part of this service. Healthy Moves is a one-on-one exercise instruction in your home with 3 months of weekly motivational calls as well as nutritional counseling with a registered dietician. Requirements are 60 + years of age and located in Adams County.

The City Harvest Food Bank consists of a "Costco of food pantries". They collect perishable and nonperishable donated foods which are distributed to more than 70 community pantries and food banks. This program serves low-income families and people experiencing homelessness throughout the Denver Metro area. The VOA Safety for Seniors Handman Program provides services for senior safety and fall prevention modifications. Minor repairs around the home, electrical, plumbing, interior/exterior types of work can be done. It provides box fans to those in need in the summers.
